



UNDERSTANDING AND RESPONDING TO DOMESTIC ABUSE

Living with domestic abuse is a devastating reality for many, affecting one in four women and one in six men in the UK over their lifetime. Domestic abuse is not a private issue – it is everyone's responsibility. This training course is for anyone working in the RBWM area and covers key elements of domestic abuse including its definition, types, indicators, effects and how to respond effectively and will enable learners to:

- Gain an understanding of the definition and dynamics of domestic abuse
- Identify additional issues faced by marginalised groups suffering domestic abuse
- Understand the extent and severity of domestic abuse
- Understand the reality of living with domestic abuse
- · Identify and recognise possible indicators of domestic abuse
- Understand the complexities of leaving an abusive relationship
- Enhance your ability to respond effectively to disclosures of domestic abuse
- Identify local policy, procedures and help available to those affected by domestic abuse
- Understand how this learning may impact on their own work situation

or new to the domestic abuse sector). The training is suitable for those working both with adults and children/young people. This is introductory training for people who

have minimal knowledge of domestic abuse.
